Environmental Responsibility In Relation To RoHS and WEEE Directives

Dear Distributor,

Eutech Instruments is committed to complying with and, where appropriate, exceeding all Regulatory and Corporate requirements for the Protection of the Environment as enacted by the European Union in the RoHS (Restriction of the use of certain Hazardous Substances in electrical and electronic equipment) and WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) directives. Our proactive approaches include :

- Designing products that minimize the use of natural resources and can easily be reused, recycled or disposed of in a safe and environmental-friendly manner.
- Monitoring and minimizing the impact of identifiable risks to the Environment associated with the manufacture and use of our products.
- Openly communicating our environmental policy and performance with our suppliers and customers.

EU Directive 2002/95/EC On Restriction Of Hazardous Substances (RoHS)

Eutech Instruments manufactures equipment as described to be within category 9 – Monitoring and Control Instruments set out in Annex 1A of EU WEEE Directive 2002/96/EC, are currently exempted from the EU RoHS Directive 2002/95/EC under “Scope” in Article 2. We are, however, taking a proactive approach to this legislation by identifying and minimizing the use of substances limited by the RoHS Directive prior to the implementation of any further legal requirement that could revoke the category 9 exemption.

EU Directive 2002/96/EC On Waste Of Electrical And Electronic Equipment (WEEE)

Eutech Instruments has appropriately marked products put on the market after August 13, 2005, with the crossed out wheeled-bin symbol imposed by the WEEE Directive. A working group has been established to make our products more readily reused, recycled or disposed of in a safe and economical manner.
